



## KnowledgePoints vs. Group Programs

How does KnowledgePoints compare to group programs:

	<b>KnowledgePoints Individualized Program</b>	<b>Group Programs</b>
Addressing Critical Skills	Based on the student's test results, we develop a program to meet their specific needs and enhance these identified or necessary critical skills.	A generic set of critical skills are addressed. If a student needs to work on other critical skills, they are usually not addressed.
Individualized Attention	With a 1:1 or 2:1 ratio, our instructors are attentive and available to offer individualized guidance as well as support.	In a group setting individualized attention is limited.
Goal Setting	We look at each college and university that the student would like to attend and after a review of test scores, we work together to set appropriate or realistic goals.	In a group setting, goal setting is generally limited to a few select colleges and universities.
Noticing & Resolving Learning Issues	Our test prep staff understands the skills and knowledge necessary to do well on the SAT/ACT exams. Our staff is trained to notice any learning issues and with our extended reading and math programs, we have options to help resolve any academic issue.	In a group setting individualized attention is limited. Noticing issues is very limited and the program is usually not designed to offer add-on options.
Program Options	Our KnowledgePoints Test Prep programs are flexible and can accommodate any family/student needs. We offer comprehensive programs in which a student will work on all necessary critical skill areas through mastery along with information and practice on strategies and working the test. We also offer abbreviated programs which can focus on specific critical skill areas while developing the necessary strategies.	Group programs are usually specific and offered for a specific number of hours at a specific time of year.
Focused Learning Environment	With our individualized program our students are focused on learning and the goal at hand. Our instructors are always available to offer guidance and support and to challenge the student to do his/her best.	In a group environment students are often working with other students. A focused learning environment is not always possible.
Relationship Building Opportunities	Our students work directly with his/her instructors on a daily basis. They develop a close-knit relationship built on mutual trust. A solid relationship between the student and his/her instructor ensures the student feels the support he/she needs and allows for open communication throughout the program.	In a group setting, students are less likely to build relationships with the instructors and staff. Relationships are usually forged amongst participants.
