### **Billing Information and Fee Explanation**

- The program fee is an annual fee based on service for the school year: September through June, but is paid in nine (9) monthly payments. Payments are due September through May by the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month.

  There is NO June program payment fee payment.
- The individual who signs the registration form is responsible for unpaid balances.
- <u>Late Payment Fee</u> All program fees are due by the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month. A \$5.00 per day late fee will be charged to your account for payments received after the due date.
- <u>Return Check Fee</u> All returned checks will incur a \$30 processing fee.
- Late Pickup Fees Late pickups will incur a \$15 fee for each 15 minute interval (per child).
- <u>Transportation Fees</u> A transportation fee may be charged by a school district if a child attends a center
  outside of his/her home school. The actual fee will be passed on to the family. Any questions regarding a
  fee should be addressed with the school district.
- You will NOT receive a monthly invoice An account summary will be sent to you periodically via email
  or sent home. It is important that you review this statement when received and keep a copy for tax
  purposes.
- Mailing Payments If you mail a payment, it must be received by the scheduled due date, the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month. All payments should be mailed to:

## **FREE Child Care**

#### Information on CCIS funding for child care

Child Care Works, a subsidized child care program helps low-income families pay their child care fees. The state and federal governments fund this program, which is managed by the Child Care Information Services (CCIS) office located in your county.

#### **Basic CCIS Eligibility Guidelines:**

- You must live in Pennsylvania and be a citizen or legal alien
- Funding covers children age birth up to age 13 (age 18 with disabilities)
- Meet income guidelines for your family size
- Work 20 or more hours a week
  - OR work 10 hours and go to school or train for 10 hours a week
  - OR have a promise of a job that will start within 30 days of your application for subsidized child care
- Have proof of identification for each parent or caretaker in the home.

If you meet the guidelines CCIS will pay a part of your child care cost, known as a

subsidy payment. You will pay a part of the cost, known as the family co-pay. Co-pay amounts are determined by family size and annual income. Family co-pays can be as low as \$5 per week. The subsidy payment and the family co-pay go directly to the child care program.

Funding is provided during the school year and summer sessions. If funding is not available at the time that a low-income, working parent applies for subsidized child care, the child may be placed on a waiting list.
