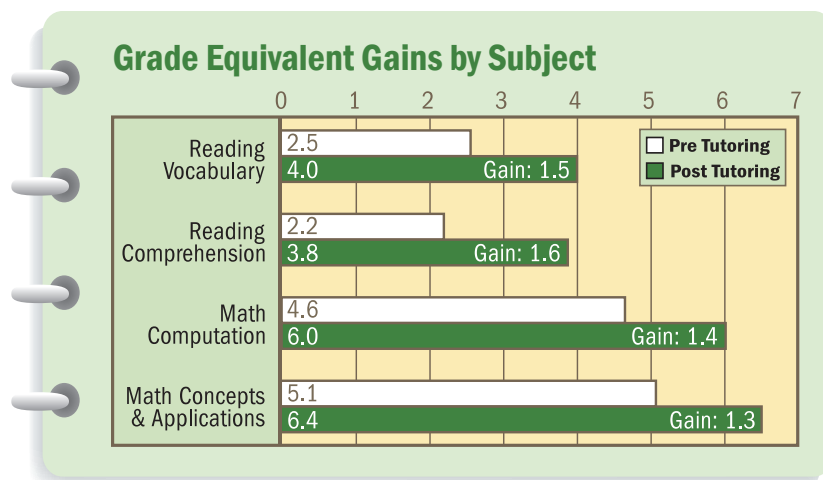


### Proving Our Results
